14-point action plan:

#5

The School psychologist and student welfare officer conduct well-being discussions with all 7th grade students in small groups (fall term). These discussions are a means of gathering students' opinions, feedback, questions on what the students' ideas are in the beginning of middle school, sharing information on the school well-being services and discussing bullying prevention and intervention.

#14 Steps of Intervention STEP 1

Preventative work done in the classroom/school


Programs which develop social and emotional skills:

- KiVa anti-bullying lessons (all grade levels)
- Positive pedagogy (all grade levels)
- Team-building (grade 7 with the youth center, School Action Day (everyone), Anti-bullying day (everyone) and whole-school assembly
- The Big Buddy program (lessons held together, involving grades 1 8)

Surveys:

- Annual class atmosphere surveys
- Student surveys
- KiVa surveys
- Well-being surveys (grades 4 5, 8)

Parental and student feedback e.g. community welfare group visits



STEP 2

Adult intervention in a possible bullying situation

- The school learns about the bullying for the first time.
- The teacher holds a discussion with the student(s) involved in the bullying (class/homeroom teacher informed).
- It is agreed how the student(s) will change his/her/their behavior.
- The teacher may consult the KiVa team or community welfare group members.
- The teacher informs all parents by Wilma (or calls).
- At least one follow-up meeting with both the bullied and the student(s) involved in the bullying.
- If the bullying stops, there is no need for further intervention.



STEP 3

The bullying continues

- Assigned adult for a student who has been repeatedly bullied
- The teacher consults the KiVa team or the KiVa team is involved
- The KiVa team may consult the welfare group and guide students to meet with a member of the welfare group
- Other means include holding e.g. a parent evening, lessons/workshops for the students, involving the youth center (and the school youth worker)
- Disciplinary educational discussion with student (parents will be informed beforehand and may be called in for the meeting)
- A follow-up meeting is scheduled



STEP 4

The bullying continues despite all previous measures

- Teacher(s), (vice)principal(s), KiVa team coordination teacher(s), and/or community welfare group members meet to discuss how to proceed
- Multi-disciplinary individual student meeting may be held
- Disciplinary measures (written warning, suspension)
- Other ways to intervene in the situation (involving the child welfare services or police: contacting the police or filing a police report, changing the class/school)
- Adequate follow-up
